After the presentation of the lighted candle the entire congregation is invited to pray the "Our Father." It is the prayer of all of Jesus' disciples. It is the prayer that we pray just before we receive the Eucharist. Now that the children have been baptized, it is expected that they will complete the sacraments of initiation, that is by the reception of confirmation and first communion. Praying together the "Our Father" is a further reminder of the newly baptized connection with all the members of the church. It would be a wonderful practice for the families to get into the habit of praying this prayer at their common meals.
