SACRAMENTAL LITURGIES: BAPTISM

The Baptismal liturgy concludes with a final blessing over the mothers, fathers and the newly baptized. The prayer recalls the joy of the Virgin Mary at the birth of Jesus. It also reminds the parents of their responsibility of being the first and best teachers of the children in the way of faith. Finally, the blessing over the entire community calls to mind that all the baptized are God's children by adoption. A hymn of praise then concludes the entire celebration. We praise the Lord for the gift of life and the Spirit that continues to pour forth its gifts upon the Church.
